SPOTLIGHT ON THE SAINTS by Bob Rawson

Saint Pauline of the Agonizing Heart of Jesus was born Amabile Lucia Visintainer on December 16, 1865. She was the second daughter of Antonio Visintainer and Anna Pianezzer in the town of Vigolo Vattaro, in Italy.

Like many others in the area, the Visintainer family was very poor but practicing Catholics. In September 1875, the family immigrated to the State of Santa Catarina in Brazil, where they founded the village of Vigolo, now part of Nova Trento.

From a young age, Pauline showed a strong devotion to Jesus and a desire to serve others. She dedicated herself to a life of prayer and spiritual contemplation, and she often fasted and practiced other forms of self-denial. From an early age she spoke of giving her life to God. After receiving her First Communion at about age 12, she began to participate in the life of the local parish, teaching catechism to children, visiting the sick and cleaning the local chapel.

On July 12, 1890, Pauline and her friend Virginia Nicolodi under the spiritual direction of a Jesuit priest, Luigi Rossi, committed their lives to religious service. They began by caring for a woman suffering from terminal cancer in a small house which was donated to the small community and the young girls began a schedule of religious living. After the woman's death the following year, they were joined by a third friend, Teresa Anna Maule.

In 1895, Rossi and Visintainer, seeing the need for a more formal and secure organization of the young women coming to them, decided to establish a religious congregation called the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Immaculate Conception. In December of that same year, the founding trio took religious vows. Visintainer took the religious name by which she is now known. The congregation, Brazil's first locally founded, grew quickly throughout the state, and in 1903, Pauline was elected their Superior General for life. She moved from Nova Trento to Ipiranga, São Paulo, where she opened a convent of the congregation in order to take care of orphans, the children of former slaves,

and aged slaves who had been left to die because they could no longer work.

In 1909, Pauline was removed from her position as Superior General by the Archbishop of São Paulo, following a series of disputes within the congregation. She was sent to work with the sick at the Santa Casa and the elderly of

the Hospice of St. Vincent de Paul at Bragança Paulista, without being able to assume an active role in her own congregation. She spent her spare time praying in support of the congregation. In 1918, with the permission of Archbishop Duarte, she was brought back by the Superior General, to live at the General Motherhouse of the congregation at Ipiranga, where she would remain until her death. Pauline was acknowledged as the "Venerable Mother Foundress", when the Decree of Praise was granted by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1933 to the Congregation of the Little Sisters, establishing it as one of pontifical right.

Pauline's health began a long, slow decline in 1938, as she fought a losing battle with diabetes. On July 9, 1942, she died with the last words, "God's will be done." She was canonized by the Catholic Church in 1947. She was the first Brazilian to be proclaimed a saint by the Catholic Church when she was canonized on May 19, 2002, by Pope John Paul II. Pauline suffered from diabetes for much of her life and is considered an "unofficial" patron saint of diabetics.

GOOSED! A NEW MUSICAL WRITTEN BY KELLY KADLEC AND DANIELLE VINUP

Get your tickets for this upcoming show!

March 6-15, 2026. Osseo High School Auditorium

After writing ten youth musicals for the Church of St George, former music director Kelly Kadlec has co-written her first full-length musical with former assistant director, Danielle Vinup. Kelly joked that she was very excited to branch out and write something not geared toward children. Ironically, this “grown up” musical is based on the characters of Mother Goose’s beloved rhymes. While *Goosed!* is based on children’s literature, it is a more grown-up musical, geared toward adults and youth eight years and older.



Goosed! is a vibrant musical which asks its characters to assess the reality of the labels placed upon them. With lives built around lines from Mother Goose’s library, the characters in the village are held captive by their names and Mother Goose rhymes. Filled with plot twists and turns, it’s a comical and poignant look at well-known characters, all grown up and as you’ve never known them before.

We meet The Old Woman Who Lives in a Shoe. She has seven adult children in residence: Wee Willie Winky, Bo Peep, Miss Muffet, Peter, Georgy Porgy, Simple Simon, and Jill. On the other side of town lives the Royal Family: Old King Cole, the Queen of Hearts, and their son, Humpty Dumpty. Additional characters, including Mother Goose herself and an ensemble of villagers and royals, round out the cast. The youngest cast members are Mother Goose’s “goslings,” her young students. What follows is an uproarious unfolding of the plot as Humpty is forced to attend a support group in order to secure a wife. This group is led by the Grand Old Duke and includes Peter (who keeps his wife in a pumpkin shell) and Georgy (who kisses girls and makes them cry). Jack is wrangled into attending and finds that he needs to know himself better (Jack be nimble? Jack and Jill? Little Jack Horner?) Meanwhile, Humpty’s life is in danger. Who is behind this vicious plot? Mary Contrary? Will anyone find their true love? Will everyone rise above their stereotypes to become the best versions of themselves? The characters sing their way through their foibles and their search for “more.”

Kelly and Danielle wrote an entirely original script and score, with Kelly even writing orchestra parts to feature a 12-piece pit Orchestra. Dani submitted the script and music to a contest that was sponsored by Bunce Performing Arts. Kelly had never worked with this organization before and was thrilled when Bunce chose *Goosed!* for their collaborative project. The original idea was that Bunce would workshop the musical, meaning they would sit down with talented actors and spend time going through the script to find what needed work and what was already presentable. After reading the script and listening to the score, they decided it was already ready to be performed and offered to produce the musical as their spring show.

The musical will take place the first two weekends of March at Osseo Senior high. Tickets are already available on Bunce’s website at www.bunceperformingarts.com or at Kelly and Dani’s *Goosed!* Website at www.goosedthemusical.com.

Kelly expressed so much gratitude for her friends at St. George, saying that their encouragement and support of her previous musicals have paved the way for this opportunity. Had it not been for her years at St. George building musicals every Advent from the ground up, she said she would have never been able to turn this dream into reality. We have been so blessed that Kelly has been helping us out by playing and directing at Masses this month! We encourage you to support her as her original musical is staged for the first time.

FAITH FORMATION SAFETY LESSONS

As part of the faith formation curriculum at St. George, the Archdiocese requires parishes to teach safety awareness lessons each year. These important lessons are part of the guidelines established by the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY) of the Archdiocese to teach age appropriate safety concepts. Over the next two months, each grade level will engage in a video and/or discussion that is developmentally appropriate for their age to highlight important concepts regarding personal and/or online safety. Some of these topics include identifying a trusted adult, telling a trusted adult when they feel uncomfortable or scared, and learning rules to keep them safe online.

Most of the curriculum for the safety awareness lessons is taken from NetSmartz, a program of the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, and has been approved by the Archdiocese. For more information, go to:
